Warwick Market is every Saturday from 9am. Farmers' Markets are usually on the 2nd and 5th Saturdays of the month.

Craft Market on the 1st Saturday of each month.

The latest rules from the government. They are liable to change at any moment it seems:

In England:

Pubs, cafe, restaurants, hairdressers, social clubs, places of worship, museums and other attractions, and indoor venues such as gyms and swimming pools are now able to reopen with social distancing measures and face coverings when required. Where 2 metres is not possible, '1 metre +' will be the rule.

B&Bs, hotels and holiday accommodation are also able to reopen if they are 'Covid Secure'. You can meet members of another household, one household per occasion, anywhere, and stay overnight. People are able to meet in groups of up to six people from different households - outside - either in parks or private gardens - so long as you observe social distancing. People can also exercise outside with up to five others from different households. That means small groups or sport teams can hold fitness sessions, but social distancing must be maintained.

Children in nurseries, early years, and Reception and Years 1 and 6 at primary schools are now able to return, but class sizes are expected to be no more than 15 pupils, with staggered breaks and hand washing. Shops are now able to open if they can achieve social distancing. You must wear a face covering on public transport and in shops.

In Warwick:

The Visitor Information Centre has reopened seven days a week, with social distancing and anti-Covid measures in place. The temporary traffic scheme with one-way systems introduced by WCC ihas now been lifted. Warwickshire County Council's on-street parking has resumed charging. WDC car parks began charging again from August 1st.

Currently public events requiring close contact indoors have been cancelled or postponed but many remain under review. Warwick Town Council is providing updates on local developments: https://www.warwicktowncouncil.gov.uk/coronavirus

Here are the headlines of the local developments so far:

- The Warwick **Visitor Information Centre** in Jury Street/Castle Street has now reopened seven days a week with social distancing measures in place (from 9.30am weekdays and from 10am at weekend). Entry via the Castle Street door. 01926 492212
- The Warwick **Saturday Market** has resumed with social distancing in place. Be prepared to queue. The next French Market is now scheduled for October 3rd.
- The Lord Leycester Hospital has reopened (closed Mondays) with a one-way system in place.
- Warwickshire County Records Office and the county's Market Hall Museum have reopened. (CRO on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays; Museum open Tuesday-Saturday). You must book in advance via Eventbrite. Tickets for the museum must be booked on a Monday for that week with only 8 people admitted at any one time. - Warwick Racecourse: The Jump Racing Season has been abandoned, and scheduled events at Warwick Racecourse have been cancelled or postponed until further notice.

- Warwick Folk Festival has been cancelled for 2020

- Tom Kerridge's Pub in the Park has been postponed until 2021
- **Unlocking Warwick** have cancelled until further notice their 'In The Ballroom' socials, their Tea and Dance Lessons, and special events.
