The majority are now considered lost. In July 2024 Sheldon's lost portrait of Henry VIII was rediscovered in Warwick's Shire Hall, hiding in plain sight. This talk explains more about the painting's history and remarkable discovery, alongside new research into Henry's forgotten state visit to Warwick in September 1511. Talk by art historian and consultant for Sotheby’s Adam Busiakiewicz, who made the discovery, and historian Aaron Manning who has undertaken primary source research into the king's progress in 1511. |
